

As I write this quarter's article for the newspaper I am preparing for the fireworks, both literally and figuratively. Literally because the date is July 1" and the fireworks have already become "bombs bursting in air" in our neighborhood and figuratively as we prepare for the upcoming legislative session that will be here before we know it, and we still have a "bunch" of work to prepare for it.

I hope everyone by now has heard of (and completed) the State FIRE & EMS Survey that has been sent out by a multitude of sources; the State Fire Marshal, The Indiana Volunteer Firefighters Association, the State Fire Chiefs, the Career Fire Service, just to mention a few. You might have gotten several emails asking you to complete this survey and here is why.

This is the most information (I think) ever gathered by the state that addresses all services and as much information. This survey, will possibly set the direction of our services for decades to come.

It will give us (the IVFA and others) a look at how we are doing in our ability and capability to serve our constituents who we are all sworn to protect. It will give us a thumb print of several objectives such as condition of apparatus, age of membership, training qualifications, response readiness, and much more data that will tell us if we are ready to provide the services we should be providing.

Your IVFA with the support of President Anderson will be putting together several committees (work groups) that will do a very complete and comprehensive review of all the data gathered and will begin to formulate our position and what we need to either improve or expand for the service we offer to those we

with another group to due an in-

This will be a major proposal for the upcoming session, adding VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS to the presumptive cancer law.

I hope to arrange a "VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER'S Additionally we will be working DAY" at the State House this year during session but I am curious

about the possible participation should we get this set up. This would have to occur on a Tuesday afternoon, Wednesday or Thursday morning most likely. If you could/would possibly be interested in attending such an event, please drop me an email and let me know and also if you can ask others and possibly get a number from your department / district so I can have a better feeling of the effectiveness of this day, that would certainly help us in setting this up. Our goal would be to meet with your elected official (and to do that I would need to know a little in advance who is attending so I can assist in scheduling your meeting) and to watch part of the House and Senate sessions to get a feel for how they function. (Or maybe dysfunction).

I hope each of you had an enjoyable and safe Fourth of July and I hope to see many of you as I attend as many district meetings as I am able to over the

Prairieton is a small little township just south of Terre Haute city limits in the District of 11A. I was born and raised in this township by my two loving parents Matt and Brenda Steward. When I was about two, my dad decided to join Prairieton Volunteer Fire Department. This became not only a major part of his life, but as well as my mom's and mine. You could find us at every fish fry, Christmas party, and quite a few training nights. The department soon became a second family to us.

There were many men and women on the department that became role models to me. One man in particular was Larry "Root" Dunford. Root was always full of laughter and good times. It was a great loss to the department when Root fell ill in the spring of 2012 and was called home to our Lord. However, his memory still lasts and his presence is always around us.

In his memory, Root's family donated money to the department to be used to better our department and community. The ladies' auxiliary decided to put this money towards a fund for Knox Boxes. In our community, we have a lot of elderly locals that have medical conditions that may not allow them to be able to answer the door when the medics are called to respond to an emergency. These boxes are attached to the outside of their main door and hold their house key. The department is the only people who have a key to get into the box to retrieve the house key. This prevents frequently damaged doors when the resident is unable to answer the door. Immediately after this fund was put into place, we presented a couple of people with a Knox Box for their home and more have been installed since then.

When I received the title of State Miss Flame 2016, I couldn't wait to get a project underway. However, I had difficulty deciding what I wanted to do and where my proceeds would go. Suddenly I knew exactly what to do. I started a gun raffle with the help of a local gun store and some great friends that were extremely eager to help me sell tickets. After all was said and done, I raised a little over \$700 that I would put toward the Knox Box fund. At the 2016 IVFA convention, I spoke about my project on Friday night. After the dinner, we had a karaoke and dance party. Here, Steve Anderson gathered the Miss Flames and had them collect just \$1 to come up and dance with him. I was shocked when Steve handed me over \$100 and told me to put it towards my project. So thank you Steve Anderson and all the Miss Flames who took part in this event. It is greatly appreciated.

I intend to present this money to the department soon and I hope it will help out a large number of community members. I am so thankful to be a part of such a wonderful organization and to be able to give back to my community that has given me so much. "Root" may no longer be with us physically today, but he still lives in our hearts



Former Miss Flame creates program for motorists

A person swerving in front of you might not be under the influence, but might be having a medical issue.

MAS-MV, Medical Alert Stickers for Motorized Vehicles is a program that was created by Jessie Dove, 2012 Indiana Volunteer Firefighters Association State Miss Flame, which hopes to provide important information about a driver within a vehicle in an auto accident.

The program consists of two reflective decals that go on the front and back windshields on the driver's side. The stickers indicate to emergency personnel to look for "Information in Glove Box". Inside of the glove box is a reflective zip lock bag that holds an index card. This index card holds important information such as medical history, allergies, medications, and emergency contacts for the person within the car. The zip lock bag follows the patient from the scene to the emergency room. Each packet consist of two decals and the identification card for \$7.



175 years of "Helping One Another"

THE INDIANA VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER

The City of Madison, Indiana was founded in 1809 and quickly developed into a busy steamboat port on the Ohio River. In 1832, many changes for the small town were occurring, in part due to the Madison, Indianapolis & Lafayette Railroad, Indiana's first railroad, and construction on it began in 1836. The population of the small town swelled due in part to many Irish immigrant laborers coming to the area for work as one of the major aspects of the construction was a cut in the bluff for an incline to overcome a 413 foot elevation change that immediately occurred when leaving the Madison port and headed north. This boom brought with it more shipping / transportation, construction and other business to the area. The growing community needed other city services and as such, Fair Play Fire Company No. 1 was organized on September 15, 1841, just a few months before the first trip up the incline on the new rail line.

The town had made attempts in the past to provide fire protection for the residents. In 1824, the town records show that the citizens organized a "Bucket Brigade". Late the next year, the Madison Town Trustees passed a resolution to supply the volunteers with ladders and three fire hooks. The citizens became more organized and in the summer of 1830 they formed the first fire company in Madison and it was named, "United Volunteer Fire Company".

As time passed, the organization of the fire company continued to change to the point where a chief was appointed. The town board voted in 1835 for a paid fire department. C. B.
