

Greetings my Fellow Officers, Members, Firefighters, Emergency Service Responders, EMTs, Paramedics and IVFAA Members.

Another quarter has passed since my last newspaper article "Fire House to the State House". So let's talk about some legislation, education and information, my three favorite topics.

Welcome to 2021 and good-bye 2020 (and not a minute too soon). Oh what a year it was as we take just a minute to look back. I have reached the age where I not only can talk about the past but have had the opportunity to live some of the past and never in all my years have I seen what I have seen in 2020. Bet I am not alone in this conversation and thought. We could talk about what was but I would rather put yesterday in the past (and learn from it) and talk with you about the future that we see today.

There will be a time sooner rather than later we hope where we can once again meet in a business or social environment, talk to each other and see the expressions on someone's face rather than via zoom video, conference call, computer aided conversations and meetings not that we can't do all of

that and be thankful we can, but sometimes being "old" school and seeing in person while you are sharing information just seems more personable to me. And I base that thought on my generational background (generation meaning a group of people born around the same time).

So where are we as we head into the Indiana General Assembly 2021 Session?

Where to begin; let's start with IVFA requested legislation. We have asked that a bill be drafted that would address "ROAD CLOSURES" with any "planned" closure of a Road, Street, Highway, Interstate, Bridge, RR Crossing or Intersection be it by private, government or public means that would cause public safety responders to alter an otherwise most direct response route.

We are also monitoring as always all bills that will or could have an impact on our opportunity to serve our communities. This sometimes becomes a challenge when we end up with 500-600 bills proposed so I ask of each of you is this; should you see, hear, be told of a bill that the language of said bill might impact either positive or negatively our ability to better / best serve, please let us know so we can look into it, monitor it, support or oppose (as appropriate) during the process of this year's session. You can contact any of the IVFA Officers, District Chairmen, and Public Relations Reps or contact me direct as your lobbyist. Our contact information can be found on the website or in this newspaper. It never hurts to have a second, third or as many as possible, set of eyes watching legislation before it becomes law rather than after it becomes law.

So how is this legislative session going to operate facing the current state of safety our local, state, and nation is facing. Glad you ask, in normal times (ha ha ha) as your lobbyist I go to the State House nearly every day during a session calendar, with a clear vision of what bills and what lawmaker(s) I need to look for to be able to share our position. In 2021 that has all changed beginning with the location where I go. We now have the Senate with its 50 members meeting in the State House in the Senate Chambers, while the House of Representatives, due to the number of House members (100), they have moved to the Government Center just west of the State House for their sessions. Oh, it gets better, so if both chambers are meeting on the same day at the same time which is the norm, it's no longer walk around the halls of the third floor of the State House and watch, listen, or see what is going on and sending in a message to ask a legislator if they have time to sneak

with you standing outside the chamber, you have to move from the Government Center to the State House depending upon where you have bills being heard and there is sometimes shall be that bills being heard will be in both chambers at the same time. Does all of this stop our opportunity to address issues, bills, and proposals with members of the General Assembly, NO, absolutely not, it just makes it a little more challenging and gives me a forced means of weight control as we walk from building to building vs around a hallway. So when we look back on the 2021 session we might say "that was different" and we will be glad to return to the NORM whatever the norm will become.

Speaking of getting back to the norm, let's talk COVID-19 vaccine. By now I hope all our membership and possibly our families have taken advantage of the opportunity to have taken the vaccine. If you are a first responder (fire, law enforcement, emergency medical services, volunteers, reserve officers), you are eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. You should have gotten some information on this early January via email from the Central Office or an officer of the IVFA, your District Chairman, your Public Relations Representative. If you did not, please reach out and make sure your contact information is available through one of these sources. It's important on many levels that the IVFA has accurate and current contact information

on you, so please only you can assure that happens.

We are still accepting applications for grants at IVY TECH for those who serve as a volunteer fire or EMS member, so if you, a member of your family, or a member of your community wants this opportunity to take advantage of a "free" grant with a very few exceptions, please visit the IVFA website and click on the Still Accepting Applications IVFA and IVY TECH Public Safety Scholarship box. Remember you must be an active member to participate in this grant program.

As the latest Educational offer the IVFA has signed an Indiana Academic Advantage Program MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING with Purdue Global (Purdue's Online Educational Program) to offer a Tuition Reduction to members of the IVFA. While all the details of the marketing and promotional is still being worked out, the offer is now available.

So as you can see the IVFA continues to work for the betterment of our members, with promotional education opportunities, legislation and keeping you informed as to information to help you the member.

Let's all hope for a better 2021, with less drama and more normal day-to-day ways and means of serving our communities.







This last year has been uncharted waters and we seem to keep staying ahead of the curve and I commend you all that have made that happen. Let me remind you, we are still not out of the PANDEMIC woods yet, so we need to keep following the guidelines set by the CDC and your local County agencies while responding on all incident types.

Remember away from runs, continue to wear your masks, continue to practice social distancing and continue to wash your hands frequently until we are told differently. I truly believe these three simple tasks helped tremendously in keeping this Pandemic under control and incheck somewhat.

We are starting to see the vaccine for COVID 19 be available for our first responders and front-line medical workers around the State. It will be up to you to receive the vaccine or not. I suggest that you do when it is offered to you. If you have questions, DO NOT be afraid to ask questions about the vaccine. I suggest you reach out to your local hospital or county health department with those questions.

I want to touch briefly on workplace stress. Workplace stress contributes to poor physical and mental outcomes. The damage stress causes to both physical and mental health is well documented. Studies by major universities found that common workplace stressors increase individuals' risk of self-rated poor health, self-rated mental illness, physician reported illnesses and even mortality. If you or you suspect someone of struggling with PTSD or stress related issues DO NOT be afraid to ask for help. There are agencies in our State that are there for assistance with these matters.

Ivy Tech Community College and its Foundation has graciously announced they will continue with the First Responders Public Safety Scholarship by allocating another \$250,000 dollars towards the program. Remember, the intent of this program is to help your department recruit new members but can also be used to retain existing members on your department. If your department has not reached out to your local high school and informed them of the program, please do so. If you need help in doing this, you can reach out to your District Chairman or Public Relations Representative in your area for directions and assistance.

I have been told we currently have around 130 members enrolled in the initial offering of this program across the State. Again, THANK YOU, Ivy Tech and its Foundation.

We are going to try to hold District Meetings again across the State starting in January/February. It has been some time that some Districts have held a meeting. If the District Chairman or the Department feels a meeting cannot be held safely in their area then it will be up to both to properly cancel the meeting and make the proper notification of the cancellation. Both President Israel and I ask the cancellation of the meeting NOT be done on the date of the meeting. Please follow the IVFA and District Facebook pages for any future meeting cancellations.

Our IVFA Lobbyist Larry Curl has begun following proposed 2021 legislation that will affect the Indiana fire service. It is too early yet in the process, but there appears to be proposed legislation again on the horizon addressing township government this session. To follow proposed 2021 legislation, go to www.ivfa.org, look for the legislative link on the page and click on it to follow any legislative updates from Lobbyist Curl.

In closing, here are some lessons I have learned from 2020. I did not create this list but felt it is appropriate to end this article and to start off the year of 2021.





Who do we respond to in times of need? The Community! Who will respond in times of





Check out heating units for winter safety

The outside temperature is falling into the twenties, the teens, and lower. Inside our homes fires are built in wood stoves, thermostats are turned up to "take off the chill", or portable heating devices are used to supplement the structure's traditional heating appliance. Regardless of the heat plant used or how it is used, these devices can cause fires.

Heating fires applies to those fires that are caused by functioning or malfunctioning central heating units, fixed or portable local heating units, fireplaces, chimneys, and water heaters. Units use multiple types of fuels such as oil, gas, coal, wood, etc. The U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) finds that an average of 51,000 residential heating fires are reported each year. It also reports the peak months for heating fires are January-February. Knowing that now is the time for heating fires to occur, let's examine some possible accidental ignition sources to look for while doing the investigation.

It is important to remember to document the area before any form of examination is conducted. The examination of the heat plant is conducted using the same systematic approach as the scene exam. This is exterior to interior and least to heaviest. Begin the exam on the heat plant's exterior. Check the flue pipe(s) and/or chimney for cracks and/or loose connections. Note the distance between the flue pipe/chimney and combustibles especially where there is a breach in structural components. Mentally ask yourself if this distance is sufficient to create pyrolysis effect of area combustibles. Check the unit's connections and controls. Is there any sign of a leaking fuel product? An example of this may be discoloration of the floor overlay or floorboard itself. Can you move connectors easily? Are there signs of tool marks? Observing these things should cause you to inquire with the owner/occupant if there were any mechanical problems with the units. Note the positions of any of the controls. Make sure that controls are in an "off" position if you suspect the heat plant is the ignition source. The interior of the heat plant requires the same basic observations as the exterior. One additional item to consider when examining the interior is the general "housekeeping" of the unit. Does it appear that filters are clean and the unit has been maintained or are there signs of inadequate maintenance?

Fifty-one percent of heat plant fires are attributed to some form of mechanical failure. Twenty-seven percent are caused by improper maintenance, and eleven percent is caused by combustibles stored too close to the unit. Be careful on how much examination of the heat plant is done. If a mechanical failure is suspected, the insurance company will most likely want to have the unit examined for possible litigation. Tampering too much with the unit could raise spoliation issues. Use this to your advantage. If the insurance company hires an engineer to examine the unit, ask for a copy of the report when the engineer is finished. This reduces the chance of spoliation, allows the "expert" to render the opinion about the heat plant, and provides documentation to support your conclusion.

So the next time you are digging out the fire scene this winter and a heat plant is located in the area of origin, keep these suggestions in mind to help you with your examination.


