

The Portland Fire Department got a new fire truck. It is a 2018 Smeal Spartan Gladiaor five man cab. It has a 1000 gallon water tank, 2 - 20 gallon foam tanks, a 1500 GPM waterous pump-rear mount. The engine is set up for fire suppression and rescue operations. It has a command light tower and hydraulic ladder rack to assist the firemen on the scene. The engine also carries tools for auto/machinery extrication, ice/water rescue along with the tools for fire suppression.



### **Home Inventory:** Make it Now!

Who needs to do a home inventory? You do.

As we enter into fire, tornado and storm season, don't be like the homeowner who couldn't replace a rare set of china or the firefighter lamenting the loss of his prized rifle and gun collection. Both were heartbroken after a recent wildfire destroyed both of their homes. They knew they should have made an inventory of their possessions but hadn't yet done

They are not alone. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners found 59 percent of us have yet to make a record of everything they own. This can lead to real problems if you should ever be burglarized or impacted by a fire, tornado or other disaster. Lack of proper documentation could delay a claim. In fact, insurance companies want some proof of the items you owned and homeowners insurance claims are processed 50-to-100 percent faster when customers have done a home inventory. The Insurance Information Institute finds those who have a complete home inventory have a better idea of the appropriate amount of insurance they need, what possessions need special scheduled personal property protection (or floaters) to help replace expensive items, and can also verify losses for income tax purposes.

- Light fixtures
- Dining room table and china cabinet



Don't be overwhelmed. Having a plan, being methodical and using the online guides will make what seems an impossible task possible. Try organizing your items by rooms, by type or by hobby.

Once you have your inventory, don't forget to update it. More

than half of those who have completed the task say they have never added new items that they've purchased. You should update the list:

- Anytime you move
- After a remodel and upgrade
- Following holidays when major purchases are usually made
- After expensive purchases like HD TVs, new sound systems, etc.


