The IVFA trailer is now available to use and we would like to see it out and visible to the public.



Nearly half (49 percent) of all home fires involving cooking equipment; unattended cooking is the leading cause of these fires. As the public may continue to avoid restaurants for some time and opt instead to do more cooking and entertaining at home, the potential for home cooking fires will likely increase as well. Keep a close eye on what you're cooking; never leave

From the **State House to** the Fire House





Some "Political" talk and more By Larry Curl,

IVFA Member and Lobbyist

Greetings Fellow officers and members, firefighters, emergency service responders, EMTs, paramedics and IVFAA members.

Another quarter has passed since my last newspaper article "Fire House to the State House".

So let's talk about some legislation, education and information, my three favorite topics.

We have had some conversations with a few legislators and this next session does not look real promising as to new legislation especially if the proposal includes "new" funding. We have been told the State has "no" new funding as it is attempting to recover from the devastation of a financial hardship due to Covid 19 just as many of our departments are having to do. If your department is, or feels it will experience a financial hardship due to the lack of "fundraising" activities, please know we are attempting to address that issue with state as well as federal means.

However, that does not mean no legislation as we are preparing to offer a proposal to address road closures to help address the concern many of us find ourselves in when we are responding to a call and reach a place in our travels where we find a road, street, drive, bridge or RR crossing has been unexpectedly (or at least to us) closed. We are asking that an advanced notification of any type of "planned" closure be given to us at least 72 hours in advance of such closing, share with our 911 operators who then would pass that information along to the first responders, be it Fire, Police, EMS. The bill is currently being (or may be) drafted as of this writing. We would like to hear from you on this or other matters that have an impact on your ability to safely and quickly respond to or care for your residence. Please reach out to your District Chairman, State Officer or myself. (Contact information is available in this edition of the newspaper).

As of this writing things are still very much up in the air on how best to handle such things as date, time and location of Organizational Day which usually would occur mid November as well as Opening Day for the 2021 session, the same not known yet.

There is talk about splitting up some of the House members or moving to a complete meeting location due to the closeness of the desks for the 100 House members, so I guess we will just stand by to see when and where we go for the next session of the Indiana General

To address some educational opportunities we are still actively pursuing members of our Volunteer Fire Service to take full advantage of the grant offer by IVY TECH. You might recall nearly a year ago a partnership was formed between IVY TECH and the IVFA, offering a "free" 2-year associate degree to any active member of a Volunteer Fire or EMS department and we have learned that same offer will be extended for another year. If vou are interested in achieving such a degree, please visit the IVFA website and click on the IVFA icon for full details. Join the many of your fellow volunteer members who are currently taking full advantage of this offer. The staff at Ivy Tech has developed a two page frequently asked Q & A as well as providing as much guidance as possible for your department to use this as a much needed "RECRUITMENT" tool. If you have questions about this program please reach out to an officer of the IVFA or visit the IVFA website.

We are currently in the process of working on an MOU with Purdue Global for some sort of an Educational package to offer to our membership as well. We hope to have some details by or before 2021.

Lastly, we should remind everyone that the State of Indiana has a program in place as well that offers "free" education / training.

FREE JOB TRAINING

Now take advantage of free state-wide training available to Workforce Ready Grant.

QUALIFY, RECIPIENTS MUST:

Be an Indiana resident and a U.S. Citizen (or eligible non-citizen)

Have a high school diploma (or equivalent) but less than a college degree

Let's make 2021 the year for education for all our members or those who want to be members of a Volunteer FIRE or EMS organization.

Lastly, let's talk information. The IVFA has recently completed a very lengthy, very detailed study on the savings we are Volunteers, save our communities we serve. The release of this information will be out soon. Be prepared to be totally shocked at your net worth in a dollar savings to your community. We hope you will see and share the tax dollar savings you bring to your community thought this report

Lastly, life has changed as we have all seen / experienced during the last nine months. The calls we make we have to exercise even greater cautions for both ourselves as well as those we serve. The simple routine things have also changed; our meetings, our fund raisers, our trainings, how we protect our families. With new buz word(s) that we have come to

eligible Hoosiers through the know is Mask, Gowns, Gloves and caution, sanitizing even more than we ever have and even the simplest things in life such as reminders to "wash your hands" and social distancing.

Another means of the new normal includes a Zoom platform to conduct meetings vs. face-to-

Let's hope we can someday soon return to the old normal or something close to but until then, please be safe and protect yourself, those we serve and with high priority, our families and loved ones.


So until we meet again, let me close with this - have a great Thanksgiving with family and remember 'ole Saint Nick will soon be knocking at your door.



It Could Never Happen Here: Preventing Suicides in the Volunteer Fire Department

I want to start with an emotion. Imagine, right now, in your department, that you get the call that one of your members has killed him or herself. It might be someone who you're close to, gone on hundreds of calls with, shared dark fire department humor. Maybe someone you thought of as a rock. Maybe (like in our department) you responded to a 911 call that was the suicide of a member.

I promise you two things. First, there is the deep and numbing grief, the pain of losing someone to suicide, which is a pain like no other. Second - and I again promise this — is the search for clues. Why, as an officer, didn't I figure this out? What did I miss? Did she say anything? Was there a change in how he was acting? Could we have done anything?

Nights of this, I promise.

You're gut reaction on hearing this scenario may be, "That could never happen here." But that is like holding the belief that a line-of-duty death could never happen in your department. We know because our work is often dangerous that we don't believe that.

The <u>facts</u> are that more firefighters die from suicide each year than in the line of duty. Since 2009, LODDs have steadily decreased while deaths by suicide have increased. In fact, in 2019, deaths by suicides represented 30 percent more fatalities than LODD's. And these are just the suicides we know about through the Firefighter Beha <u>Alliance</u> (FBHA) reporting system – it is likely there are more.

Yet, in most volunteer departments, the time spent training on emotional health and suicide prevention is pale or non-existent compared to the time spent training to be safe on the fireground.

Like understanding the factors that lead to exertion deaths and deaths by vehicle crashes, we need to know how suicides happen and what we can do to prevent them. Our goal as officers and firefighters should be reducing death and harm for our brothers and sisters no matter where it may arise.

The Sea We Swim In

Firefighters swim in the same sea as the rest of society, so it is essential to understand what is going on in the rest of the country before we dive specifically into the firefighter world.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, in the firefighter suicides are reported. United States, suicide is the SECOND leading cause of death for For volunteers, this is probably individuals between the ages of 10 and 34 (unintentional injuries are the even more of an understatement leading cause) and the fourth leading cause for individuals between 35 and 54. In 2017, over 47,000 individuals died via suicide (almost twice listed on death certificates. the number of homicides).

In data obtained by the American Psychological Association, the rate of suicides has increased by nearly 33 percent since 1999, with a sharp Let's cut to the chase. We have a uptick in 2006. Further, suicide rates tend to rise during times of recession, especially in middle age and older men.

It is too early to understand how the pandemic, recession, and social unrest we are now experiencing might affect the suicide rate. But one report out of Cook County, Illinois, found the 2020 suicide rate in their community is "on pace to double" last year's, with an alarming increase in the number of suicides among African Americans.

There is another way that individuals are taking their lives, and it is just as tragic. These are the <u>deaths of despair</u>. As our economy and society are transforming, many individuals feel left behind and are killing themselves by drinking, overeating, and unintentional overdosing on drugs, in addition to suicides. One source noted that 65,000 deaths a year could be categorized as deaths of despair (and a concurrent decline in life longevity in the U.S.).

Why Individuals Attempt Suicide

Researchers mostly agree that there is rarely one reason why someone might attempt suicide. It is usually a confluence of factors. Common reasons are changes in life circumstances like:

- Being laid off or fired
- Divorce
- Economic hardship
- Addiction (and alcoholism)
- Depression (and PTSD)

The Firefighter World

Against that backdrop, look at the unique set of circumstances that we face as firefighters. In the civilian world, firefighters, EMS providers, police, doctors, nurses, and social workers experience the world differently. Although it is a choice we make, it comes with a set of similar challenges, emotional and psychological, that put us at a higher risk for depression, PTSD, and suicide.

According to an article in Law Enforcement Today, "PTSD and depression rates among firefighters and police officers have been found to be as much as five times higher than the rates within the civilian population, which causes these first responders to commit suicide at a considerably higher rate (firefighters: 18/100,000; police officers: 17/100,000; general population 13/100,000)."

An important note is that first responder suicides are likely undercounted. According to Jeff Dill, founder of the FBHA, only about 40 percent of

because only one profession is

What Can We Do?

mental health crisis in the country. Over 46 million Americans report some kind of mental illness, from severe depression to PTSD to schizophrenia. Unfortunately, as a culture, we are in denial that we have a problem.

The fire service, in many ways, is a microcosm of this. As firefighters, we deal with some of the worst circumstances, the life-changing crises that people encounter. What we see, a single terrible call or the years of cumulative tragedy, can cause us temporarily (or sometimes permanently) to lose our bearings. If left untreated, it can lead to depression, PTSD, and even suicide. These are just the facts.

And yet, we as a culture, an old and proud culture dating back to 1736, are largely in denial of this. If you listen to our culture, the message is to be superhuman, suck it up, not be affected, and not admit "weakness."

Generation after generation of firefighters have absorbed this message. Although we've always paid the price in depression, substance abuse, and suicide, it is now 2020, and we have come a long way in our understanding of the stressors that plague us and what we can do to help.

Denial is not the answer.

I've written previously about what we can do as individuals to help minimize the possibility of getting and reducing the symptoms of PTSD. In this article, I want to suggest a few ideas for officers

- it could never happen ...

about preventing suicides.

- 1. First, as officers, we need to educate ourselves on the facts about suicides in the fire service.
- 2. We need to educate our firefighters and EMS personnel about suicides, the causes, what the signs are, and where and how they can get help.
- Remember, "Leaders go first." As officers, we need to be open about our experiences with hard calls and how they affected us. We want to give firefighters permission to open up and talk about what they've gone through or are experiencing. When leaders go first, it provides "air cover" for others to talk.
- Depression, PTSD, and suicide ideation are NOT SIGNS of weakness. As officers, we need to hammer this message home. We need to be "tough" on scenes, sometimes detached, but having an emotional reaction to what we see is normal. Expressing those feelings, not repressing them, is healthy.
- The best way to communicate all of this to firefighters is through stories. When you tell a story about a call, how it affected you, and what you did about it (or didn't) is how we
- Have an informal and formal process for firefighters to get help. Most importantly, make sure that peer counseling is available. Firefighters (like police and military) are reluctant to talk to individuals who don't "get it." Talking to other firefighters is more comfortable and often more productive.
- For those who need to talk to a behavioral healthcare professional, the National Volunteer Fire Council maintains a directory of local providers who are ready and equipped to help first responders. Providers are vetted by the FBHA and either have firsthand experience with the emergency services or have taken a course through the FBHA. The directory is updated monthly as more providers are added.
- Our responsibility is to ensure that there is no bullying, abuse, or sexual harassment in our departments. They have no place in a professional volunteer department.
- Finally, I've listed resources at the end of this article that we can have readily accessible as officers in case we need them.

We know that firefighting and EMS are not just "normal" vocations. They come with a risk to both our physical and emotional health. As officers, it is our responsibility to ensure that our firefighters and EMS personnel are as safe — physically and emotionally — as possible. We want them to stay in the vocation for a long time and retire intact.

A large part of that equation lies in having vibrant, healthy, open, and trusting cultures. You know those cultures as soon as you walk into the bay. Firefighters greet you, they're happy and purposeful, there is little blaming and lots of stories. Those cultures make you want to belong

It takes work as officers to build and sustain those kinds of departments. But the payoff is immense. The right culture, where it is "normal" to talk and share about bad experiences, does a lot of the work for us. The right culture, where we are looking out for others' emotional safety, will help us spot and be able to help those in trouble. The right culture, where we are open about the emotional risks of firefighting and EMS, will help everyone stay healthy.

The goal is not to get that call in the middle of the night that one of our brothers or sisters has taken their own life. In the end, it is not about statistics. It is about looking each of your firefighters and EMS members in the eye and letting them know you have their back. That no matter how hard it can be, no matter how painful, there is a way back.

Finally, in the Talmud, it's written that all men are responsible for one another. For us, it starts with our brothers and sisters. We can be the difference makers. Learn about mental health and suicides. Have the conversation about suicide. Do the trainings. Organize a peer counseling program. Remember, leaders go first. We are the ones responsible for starting.

Be Brave. Be Kind. Fight Fires.

Tips to prevent fires caused by space heaters

As fire departments across the country battle winter home fires, the advisor today at 1.800.800.9410 or U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) reminds consumers to demonstrate care when purchasing and using space heaters.

> CPSC estimates that space heaters, including both fixed and portable heaters, are associated with about 21,800 residential fires every year.

> About 300 people die each year in fires by these heaters. Fuel-burning space heaters also can cause carbon monoxide poisoning and indoor air pollution, because of improper venting or incomplete combustion.

> Too many space heater fires are reported each year. The CPSC has worked hard with industry to improve safety standards for space heaters, and consumers must exercise care in their purchase and use.

> Consumers should be aware that older space heaters might not meet the newer safety standards. The CPSC has worked to upgrade the industry standards on electric, kerosene and unvented gas space heaters. An automatic cut-off device is now required, which turns off electric or kerosene heaters if they tip over. More guarding around the heating coils of electric heaters and the burner of kerosene heaters also is required to prevent fires. CPSC worked to upgrade the industry standard on unvented gas heaters, as well, to provide an oxygen depletion sensor to shut off the heater if the oxygen level drops too low.

Here are some CPSC safety tips for buying and using space heaters:

- 1. Select a space heater with a guard around the flame area or heating element. Place the heater on a level, hard and nonflammable surface, not on rugs or carpets or near bedding or drapes. Keep the heater at least three feet from bedding, drapes, furniture, or other flammable materials.
- 2. Choose a space heater that has been tested and certified by a nationally recognized testing laboratory. These heaters meet specific safety standards.
- 3. Keep doors open to the rest of the house if you are using an unvented fuel-burning space heater. This helps prevent pollutant build-up and promotes proper combustion. Follow the manufacturer's instructions to provide sufficient combustion air to prevent CO production.
- 4. Never leave a space heater on when you go to sleep. Never place a space heater close to any sleeping person.
- 5. Turn the space heater off if you leave the area. Keep children and pets away from space heaters.
- 6. Have a smoke detector with fresh batteries on each level of the house and a carbon monoxide detector outside your sleeping area. 7. Be aware that mobile homes require specially designed heating
- equipment. Only electric or vented fuel-fired heaters should be used.
